# Welcome to Godolphin's Enhancement Programme

This is a programme which, through contributions, has been enhancing the lives of girls at Godolphin over the past 10 years under the name of the Annual Giving Programme.

The aim is to enhance the day to day lives of the girls at Godolphin, be that through scented candles and relaxing music in the Health Centre, comfortable chairs to snuggle up in and read a book in the library or a microwave and coffee mugs to make that delicious hot chocolate on a winter evening.

There are six strands within the programme and contributors may elect to support a specific area of the school, or contribute to the Head's Discretionary Fund.

## The new programme

As the school moves forward with its Vision 2026, so does the Enhancement Programme and there are new areas in which contributions may be made. The primary objective of the programme is to enhance the experience of girls at Godolphin.

This can only be achieved through the generous contributions of members of the Godolphin Community.

## How the Enhancement Programme works

The Enhancement Programme is a subcommittee of the Governors' Development Committee, and they are both chaired by the same governor. The Enhancement Programme committee is made up as follows:

- ◆ Chair
- ◆ Head
- ◆ Prep Head
- ◆ OGA representative
- ◆ Current member of staff (voted for by the staff forum)
- ◆ Past member of staff (by invitation, in consultation with staff forum)
- ◆ Parent representative from the senior school
- ◆ Parent representative from the senior school
- ◆ Parent representative from the prep school
- ◆ Representative of parents of former pupils
- ◆ Director of External Relations (by invitation)
- ◆ Marketing and Development Officer (by invitation)

The committee meets three times a year and all staff are encouraged to submit bids to be tabled at the meetings.

There is a very clear set of disbursement guidelines, which are circulated to all staff when bids are called for, and which are used by the committee to make their final awards.
